Tech Trek News 2025

The Tech Trek (TT) season is getting underway and your team (Pam Bodnar, Debbie Rosenow, Katy Azevedo, and Carol Holzgrafe) is working with a new approach. Because our potential camper nominees and their families—and even some of our nominating teachers—don't really know what to expect from TT, we met recently with math and science teachers from Chico and Bidwell junior highs.

Besides plates of cookies, we presented them with why AAUW does Tech Trek, what camp is really like, and who thrives in that environment. Debbie offered links to the Davis camp video and other on-line sites that will help ease the feeling of jumping into something totally unfamiliar (google "tech trek davis").

Also, at Bidwell, some of our 2024 campers were a terrific hit when they came to tell their experiences. To further help with the comfort level of girls (and their families) deciding to accept our "camperships," we plan to share the experience of Sadie Arendt, a 2024 Paradise camper. Sadie kept a detailed journal of her six days and offered to share it with other girls who want to know: What IS Tech Trek really like?

With the board's approval, we have requested eight places at the Davis camp; but, if there is not enough room there, we can send a few to Tech Trek at UC Santa Cruz, now in its second year.

NOTE: The number of girls the Chico branch can send to Davis will depend on the number of volunteers we provide to the camp. One teacher said she was interested in being an adult counselor and at least one member of our TT team may be also. But, should you enjoy the company of nifty 13-year-old STEM-oriented girls and want to spend a week on the Davis campus (lots of flat walking, good A/C, good food), contact us for more information. Further, we want to thank **The Discovery Shoppe League** for its grant of \$8,100 to send local girls to camp; Soroptimist International of Chico also provides a campership. Other sources come from generous branch members, the Antique Appraisal Faire, and anonymous donors. The results are worth it!

Public Policy/Social Action

Our AAUW California Public Policy Committee studies all upcoming bills and decides which ones work closely with AAUW's mission of supporting all women and girls. These are the three California bills that AAUW-CA is supporting this legislative session:

AB 2099 (Bauer-Kahan-McCarty) Social and Racial Justice for All Members of Society: This bill would make a new *misdemeanor* or a felony (Wobbler) for sharing personal information or images of certain individuals, such as reproductive health care providers, with the intent of causing harm or violence against them or anyone living at the same address.

AB 2326 (Alvarez) Equal Access to Quality Public Education for All Students: This measure requires the three public higher education institution chancellors/presidents to gather information on each institution's compliance with Title IX, and to provide an annual report, including a direct presentation to the Assembly and Senate Subcommittees on Education Finance. This would include information on new policies adopted to improve the reporting process, investigation, and resolution of complaints.

AB 2843 (Petrie-Noris; Co-author Addis) Economic Security for All Women; Social and Racial Justice for All Members of Society: Several factors may impact a rape survivor's decision to seek care and/or report a rape, but costs for medical care should not be one of them. AB 2843 eliminates cost-sharing, including deductibles, from being imposed on any rape survivor seeking medical care following a rape. Forensic exams and rape kits are free, however, other costs associated with an ER visit are not for those with private insurance. AB 2843 ensures that those individuals who wish to report a rape and file charges will have the benefit of a rape kit test and forensic exam to provide evidence to secure more convictions for acts of sexual violence. Moreover, they can receive the care that they need following a traumatic sexual attack.

FYI: Did you know that the AAUW California website (<u>aauw-ca.org</u>) has a great deal of information, answers to questions, and help you will need or want to know? Please take some time to investigate the site, particularly if you hold a branch officer position. There are tool kits on how to do your job, deadlines, what to expect, and where to go if you have questions.

If you would like to follow the progress of these bills: go to aauw-ca.org, click on Branch Tools at the top, scroll down the Public Policy picture, and click on the Bill Tracker 2024 rectangle. If you want information on Tech Trek, from the home page click on Projects/Programs, then click on Tech Trek. The AAUW California Web Team is highly skilled and works hard to provide the answers you want; do them a favor and use what they have provided. If you are looking for a specific thing on the national website (aauw.org), "google" it (for example, type "aauw membership") in your favorite browser (Google, Mozilla, DuckDuckGo, Safari, etc.) and it will take you right there.
