### **DID YOU KNOW ...**

.. that our local bus service, the B-Line, has transportation services for seniors and those with disabilities? The *B-Line Paratransit* is a shared ride service made up of two programs: (1) *ADA Paratransit*—for those with a documented disability that limits their functional mobility so that either some or all of the time they cannot use the fixed route and (2) *Dial-A-Ride*—for residents in the service area who are 70 or older, regardless of disability status. Both services require that you fill out an application to verify eligibility and to provide your address for pick up when using the service. This may

be a great solution when you need a ride to a doctor's appointment or other meeting. Visit www.blinetransit.com for all the details.

### **TOOLS FOR FAIR SCHOOLS**

#### **School Board Project**

We all know book banning and censorship of educational materials are rapidly sweeping across the country. And lately, they are on our doorstep! But we don't have to—and we won't—tolerate it. <u>Click here</u> to download the webinar and toolkit to learn what the AAUW Public Policy team is doing about it, and how you can help.

The *School Board Project* committee members will explain the breadth of the problem and the scope of the proposed solution, along with a representative from the League of Women Voters to guide members with some useful tips about speaking out at school board meetings.

Protect your school board from members who want to ban books, censor curricula, and institute policies that harm LGBTQ+ students. AAUW California's *School Board Project* encourages all our members to become vigilant observers of their local districts.

On September 25, 2023, Governor Newsom signed <u>AB 1078</u> into law, officially preventing school districts from banning books and censoring curriculum based on the materials' depiction of inclusive and diverse perspectives. Specifically, the law reaffirms, in the Introduction, that

- California supports accurate and inclusive education;
- the California Constitution guarantees pupils equal protection under the law;
- California schools have an obligation to combat bias against pupils within their schools;
- accurate and inclusive education are essential to ensure the educational success of all pupils;
- requires the Department of Education to develop guidance and public educational materials to ensure that all Californians can access information about educational laws and policies that safeguard the right to an accurate and inclusive curriculum;
- requires all school districts to have sufficient instructional materials for all students that align with approved content standards;
- adds to list of included topics in social sciences textbooks: the role and contributions of people of all genders, Latino Americans, LGBTQ+ Americans, and members of other ethnic, cultural, religious, and socioeconomic status groups;
- reduces a school district's funding formula allocation if the district does not provide sufficient Instructional materials pursuant to these provisions;
- prohibits governing members of school districts from refusing to approve or prohibiting the use of any book or instructional material on the basis that it contains inclusive and diverse perspectives.
